OHSU School of Dentistry Portland \$5,000
Funding to support both limited emergency treatment and comprehensive dental care for children from low-income families. Treatment will be provided by pre and post doctoral students under supervision from the OHSU faculty.

Salem Keizer Head Start Salem \$4,000
Funding to provide three fluoride varnish treatments for students and their at risk siblings during the 2009-2010 school year.

Siskiyou Community Health Center Grants Pass \$3,000
Funding to support their Dental Prevention Program which provides oral health services, such as oral health education, dental screenings, fluoride varnish and, where indicated, dental sealants, to children and adolescents in Josephine County.

St. Vincent de Paul Society Eugene \$5,000
Funding to launch a pilot program to provide preventative and regular dental care as well as emergency dental treatment to homeless children and low-income children between the ages of birth to six. This program will also provide preventative dental education to both parent and child.

Virginia Garcia Memorial Foundation Cornelius \$5,000
Funding for the OB Baby Dental Project which targets pregnant women with periodontal disease. The project aims to improve the dental health of the mothers and the health of their newborn infants.

White Bird Clinic Eugene \$3,000
Funding for dental care and oral health education for low-income children living in Lane County. This funding will help at least 60 children receive emergency, preventative and restorative care.
